#### WHAT IS THIS COURSE ABOUT?

This course focuses on the refinement of students' skills and knowledge in visual arts. Students will analyse art forms, use theories of art in analyzing and producing art, and increase their understanding of stylistic changes in modern and contemporary Western art, Canadian (including Native Canadian) art and art forms from various parts of the world. Students will produce a body of work demonstrating a personal approach to drawing and painting.

Prerequisites: AWP 3M or AVI 3M

#### **COURSE OVERVIEW**

#### **Units of Instruction:**

- 1. Perceptual studies and figure drawing: The human figure in art
- 2. Classical illustration and realism: Three dimensional object drawing
- 3. Painting in acrylics: Student directed design using the theory of The Seven Colour Contrasts
- 4. Watercolour painting: Student directed design using watercolour techniques and colour theory
- 5. <u>The Self Portrait in oil:</u> The final studio summative assignment where students utilize oil paints to create a self portrait

- Appropriation in art
- Pre-instruction drawings
- Contour line drawing of a historic church
- Form drawing of an egg: study of white on white and the de-emphasis of lines
- Perspective: a view through a doorway- study of interior architectural space
- Self portrait drawing

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#### VISUAL ARTS DEPARTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- 1. It is the student's responsibilities to have current work and materials (ALWAYS including pencil, ruler and eraser) out of their lockers and with them at the start of each class.

  - Fine line black marker (Sharpie Ultra preferred)
  - Glue stick
  - Brushes & Palette (Brush kits are offered as enhancements. Some brushes are supplied in the classroom, if you want to have your own set you need to purchase them on your own or from the department)
  - Sketchbook (An 8.5 x 11, 160 page hardcover sketchbook can be purchased from the Art Department for \$10.00. The sketchbook can also be used in other or future art courses.
