#### WHAT IS THIS COURSE ABOUT?

This course emphasizes learning through practice; introducing and building the basics on what students will need to know in order to continue on and be successful in further art courses. Through experimentation with several different mediums (pencil, ink, pencil crayon, watercolour and acrylic paint) students will learn about new ideas, materials and processes for artistic thinking and experimentation and how to successfully apply the elements and principles of design. Students will also explore about the connections between their works of art and historical artwork in context.

#### **COURSE OVERVIEW**

#### **Units of Instruction:**

- 1. Name design in sketchbook: An introduction to the course using names and personalization
- Value scales and geometric shapes: Exploring shading techniques and value and drawing three dimensional shapes and shade them accurately according to the light source
- 3. Colour & Texture: Learning how the colour wheel works and a texture study drawing
- 4. **Animal Metamorphosis:** Using shading techniques, texture and proportion to create a metamorphosis between two distinctly different animals
- 5. Clay animal: Exploring clay techniques to create a three dimensional animal sculptures
- 6. <u>West Coast watercolour:</u> Learning the basic watercolour techniques within an art history context of the Haida culture
- 7. One & two point perspective: A sketch on how to draw places in perspective using a horizon line and vanishing point
- 8. **Egyptian acrylic:** Learning the basic techniques of acrylic paints through an art history context of Egyptian art
- 9. <u>Personal Mural Proposal:</u> The final studio summative assignment where students utilize all types of mediums explored during the semester to create a design proposal for a personal mural piece

Preparation and process work throughout the semester

#### Art Appreciation, Theory and Art History:

- Gallery assignment (if applicable)
- Critiques
- Art History (Prehistoric, Egyptian, Roman, Greek and West Coast) integrated throughout the semester

#### Term Work- 70%

Thinking and Inquiry- 10% Knowledge and Understanding- 20% Application- 60%

Communication- 10%

Final Summative Assignment- 30%
