WHAT IS THIS COURSE ABOUT?

This course enables students to further develop their knowledge and skills in visual arts. Students will use the creative process to explore a wide range of themes through studio work that may include drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking and the creation of collage and multimedia work. Students will use the critical analysis process when evaluating their own work and the work of others. Western art, Canadian art and art forms from various parts of the world will be analyzed.

- 6. Media Study: This is the final culminating assignment that is a student directed artwork
